



BHS/NAHR/ORUK Research Fellowship Specification 2022

The British Hip Society (BHS) and Orthopaedic Research UK (ORUK) are proud to offer a new co-funded 2-year Research Fellowship,

This is a full-time funded fellowship of £55,000 per year and it is expected that the applicant will be a trainee in Trauma and Orthopaedic Surgery in the UK.

The UK Non-Arthroplasty Registry is the largest hip preservation registry in the world and has been collecting outcomes of patients undergoing hip preservation surgery since 2012. The database provides opportunity for in-depth exploration to look at various factors that might have an influence on the success of hip preservation surgery. There is potential for linking the data with HES data available from NHS Digital. We would expect the applicant to have background experience of analysis of large datasets.

You will work closely with both the NAHR/ORUK/BHS Research Committee and NAHR working group to ensure the goals and outputs of the research align with their requirements.

Applicants must use the fellowship to support the award of a higher degree, registered with a UK University.

We would envisage the successful applicant to start the period of full-time research in August 2022/ Feb 2023.
