Dear Colleagues,

Thank you so much for attending the 2024 Annual Scientific Meeting and Instructional Course in Belfast. I hope you enjoy the meeting but also take some opportunity to enjoy Belfast too, either yourself or with friends and family.

Thanks to the organising committee, particularly Simon Buckley, Satish Kutty and Joanna Maggs, who have been working incredibly hard to deliver the BHS scientific programme and meeting. But in addition, all the BHS executive and all members and non-members for any help they have lent as I am acutely aware there are so many unacknowledged people helping in so many ways. I can't list you all, but your help is truly appreciated.

It's a great honour that Professor Dan Berry from the Mayo Clinic in Rochester will be delivering the Presidential Guest Fireside Dialogue with me and, I am very pleased that we could have an Irish Charnley Legacy Lecturer with Derek Bennett from Mayo, Ireland.

The main scientific program will include the reintroduction of hot topics in focus session with Fares Haddad. The other Topics in Focus will include Non Arthroplasty Hip Surgery, Hip resurfacing versus total hip arthroplasty for young active patient and consequences for follow-up and potential revision. There will also be contribution from our physiotherapist colleagues on non-arthroplasty treatment of osteoarthritis. In addition, the topical issue of theatre efficiency and productivity as we recover from the post covid effect will be examined by David Beverland. Other issues covered include complex case discussions, reviews of NAHR, BAJIR and NJR. The new JAM sessions had positive feedback last year and have been maintained. Finally a big thank you to the industry exhibitors for their fantastic support and I encourage everyone to please visit their stands and attend their symposia sessions.

The last day of the programme will have the Instructional Course running in parallel. The theme this year is Trauma and Revision hip surgery. Our Culture and Diversity Committee have again planned a variety of events to keep everyone involved and Joanna Maggs will keep us up to speed on all of these. Again, local school children will be contacted with the idea to provide them with exposure to hip surgery, and again another for medical students via the British Orthopaedic Medical Students Association.

Please do download the BHS 2024 app (details will be forthcoming) to fully engage with all parts of the conference and to get your CPD certificate afterwards.

Much as I have always love discussing hip surgery, I hope that in addition to meeting friends and colleagues for professional interaction that you still have time to have fun in Belfast too, possibly with family also. Looking forward to seeing you all on 28th February!

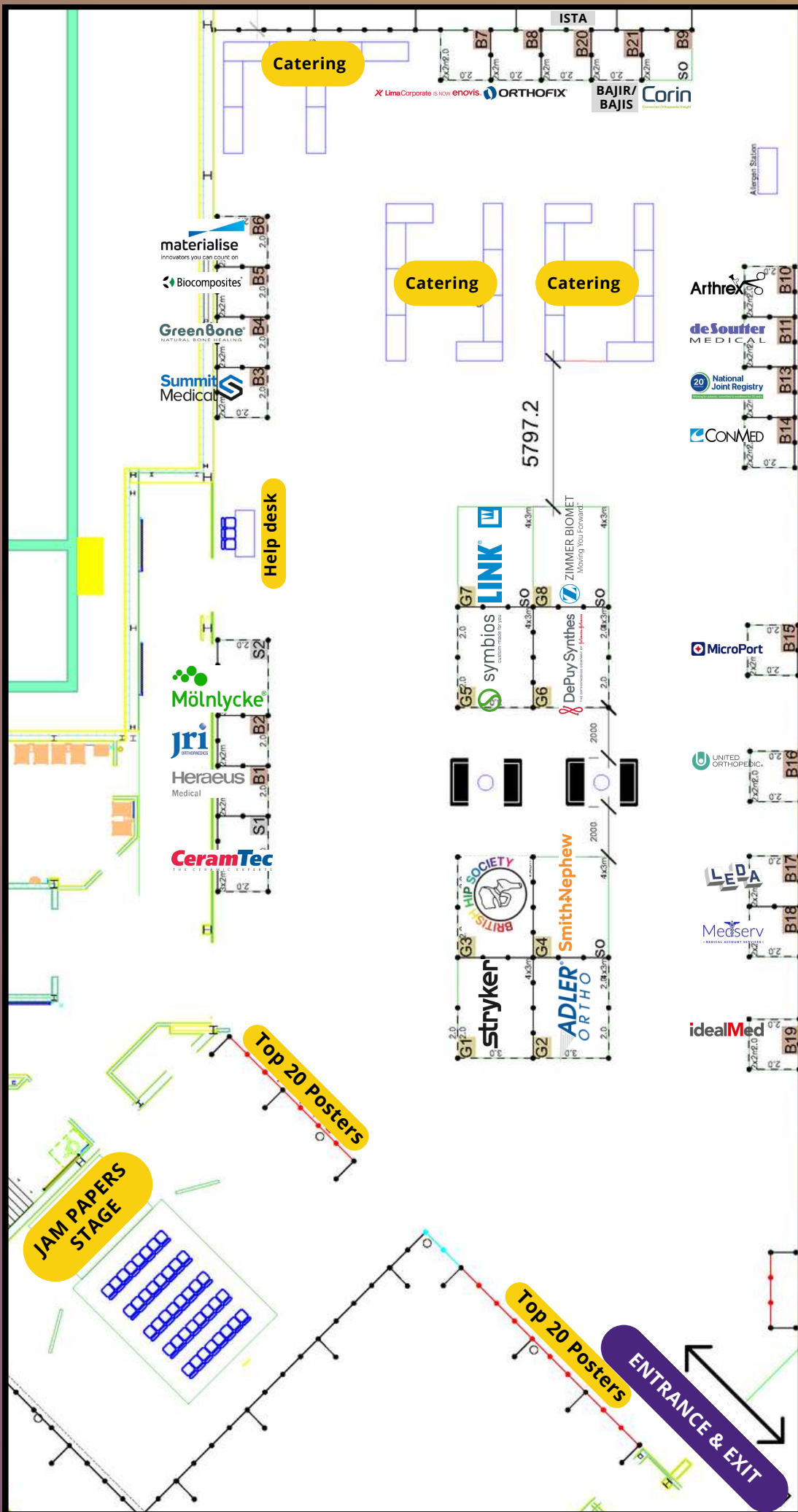

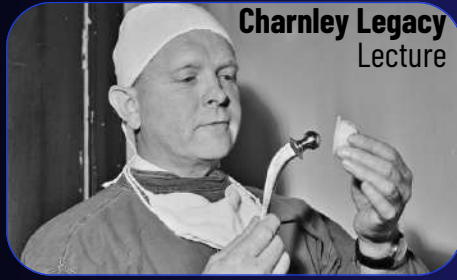

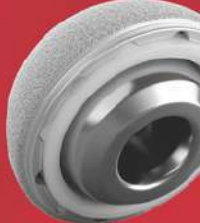
